Eligibility: All resident physicians, with the exception of PARIM awards committee are eligible to be nominated. Nominations may be from a resident or medical student. To nominate a resident, please fill out the nomination form with a brief letter of explanation (250 words maximum) describing why the nominee merits recognition. This paragraph should outline specific examples of the resident's teaching skills, and can include direct quotes from learners.

Please mark all submissions with "Attention: PARIM Awards Committee."

Selection: Selection is completed by the PARIM Awards Committee on an annual basis.

Criteria for Selection:

1. Commitment to the evaluation process: accessibility and value of constructive feedback
2. Demonstration of Clinical Expertise and Evidence based approach to resident and medical student education
3. Embodiment and integration of the CanMeds Roles
4. Strong record of integrating ethics and professionalism to education
5. Evidence of effective leadership and mentorship ability

Award Value: The selected Resident will receive \$100 donation to a charity of his or her choosing. The name of selected recipient will be announced at the annual Resident Appreciation Dinner.
